The money is to help us lower the age limit for Safe Places members. People can now join the scheme from the age of 14.

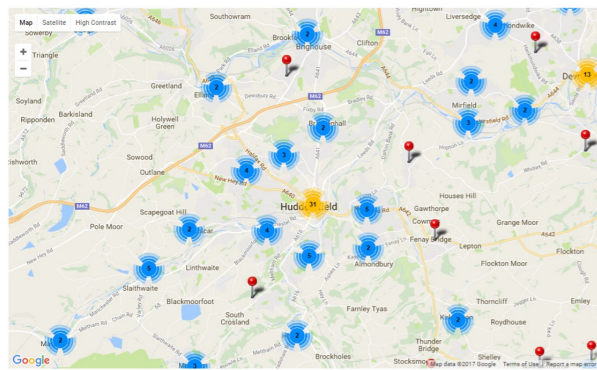
We have worked with the Children's Safeguarding Board to make sure this is the right thing to do.

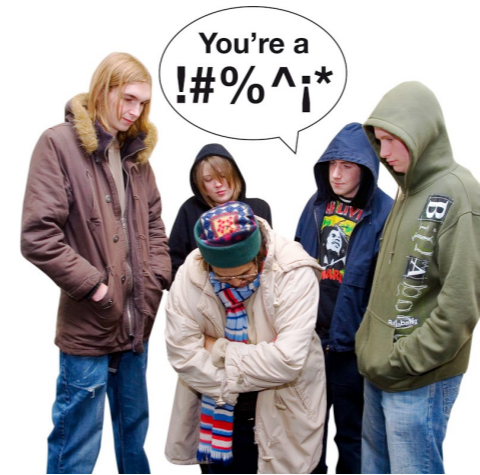

Hate Crime



There has been a new hate crime strategy launched in Kirklees. The strategy tells us what the Police, Council and other partners have made a priority when looking at hate crime.

A hate crime is when a crime is committed against you because of who you are. This might be because you have a disability.

Priorities include:

- Having a service that is victim-focused and protects everyone equally
- Preventing hate crime
- Supporting victims of hate crime
- Effective action against perpetrators
- Improving community engagement and confidence

Hate crime is wrong. If you think you have been the victim of a hate crime tell someone you trust or tell the Police.

Ring the Police on 101 or ring 999 in an emergency.

A Safe Place can also help you to report a hate crime. They have more information about reporting centres and online reporting.
